The non-profit Jewish Community Housing Corp. (JCHC) is now seeking to build a second senior housing development of 119 low income units on a 5-acre vacant parcel of the MetroWest property 10 East.

The housing corporation provides housing options with services for senior citizens in Morris and Essex Counties by developing, owning and managing five apartment buildings with more than 600 units of senior housing.

The JCHC is the owner and manager of the Lester Senior Housing Community, located on the Aidekman Family Jewish Community Campus in Whippany, which has 120 independent living apartments and 55 assisted living units.
